

To the non-originating good quality for a TPL from Mexico? IAB

Tariff preference levels (TPLs) have been established for certain non-originating garments to be entered under the NAFTA rate up to a specific quantity, once that quantity is reached, the product is dutiable at the Column 1 rate.

Are these garments made of foreign fabric that was both cut and sewn or otherwise assembled in the NAFTA territory?

(This information should be on the importer's textile declaration)

*Certificates of Eligibility are issued in Mexico by the Ministry of Commerce and Industrial Promotion (SECOFI)

**ABI cannot currently process more than two tariff #'s per line item. For an entry with a 99# a 61/62# and applicable 9801 or 9802#, entry

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR TPL FROM MEXICO:

Must be 02 type entry

Must submit Certificate of Eligibility* at the time of entry

Certificate # must be reported in box 34 on 7501

The appropriate 9999# AND Chapter 61 or 62 # must be reported on the 7501.**

TPLs are still subject to all Quota/Visa restraints from Mexico

A textile declaration must be submitted from each mfr. and processor involved (including mfr. who cut the fabric)

MX in front of Chapter 61 or 62 # on the 7501 and on the invoice.

In those cases where both an absolute quota and TPL exist for Mexico, report only the visa # in column 34

The importer must pay MPF

Garments qualify under TPL 9802.00.8055

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR TPL 9802.00.8055:

Must be 02 type entry

Must submit Certificate of Eligibility* at the time of entry

Certificate # must be reported in box 34 on 7501 9802.00.8055 AND Chapter 61 or 62 # must be reported on the 7501.**

TPLs are still subject to all Quota/Visa restraints from Mexico

In those cases where both an absolute quota and TPL exist for Mexico, report only the visa # in column 34

Must submit Assembler's Declaration signed by the assembler indicating that the fabric was cut in the U.S.

MX in front of Chapter 61 or 62 # on the 7501 and on the invoice.

Once this TPL fills, the merchandise must be entered under 9802.00.8065, and is dutiable at the Column 1 rate for the value added in Mexico.

The importer must pay MPF
